BILLY WALKER

Billy Walker has been involved in gospel music his entire life. Matter of fact, on his way home from the hospital at birth, he attended his very first concert at Lydia Baptist Church in Cross City, Florida. From there his path was laid out in front of him. At the age of five years old, he began to play the drums on stage for the group that his family was involved in at the time.

From the drums to vocals, Billy now sings lead and harmony vocals for The Walkers, as well as playing on the drums and percussion on a few songs. As well as these responsibilities, he runs the sound for the group as well.

In 1995, for a good part of the year, Billy sang with one of the top groups in the gospel music industry at that time, The Steeles. He was a part of their "Southern Steele" album which produced two number one songs, "God Kept His Promise" and "I Got Up And Went". "Oh What A Mighty God" landed at the number two position.
